Dr. Md. Mobarak Hossain Khan (Principal Investigator)

Md. Mobarak Hossain Khan has been working as a Professor and Chairperson of the Department of Social Relations at East West University (EWU), Bangladesh since January 2018. Before joining at EWU, he occupied faculty positions (1993-2017) at different public universities in Bangladesh (Bangladesh Agricultural University, Jahangirnagar University), Germany (Bielefeld University), and Saudi Arabia (King Faisal University). He also worked as a researcher at the Institute of Epidemiology, Disease Control and Research (IEDCR), Dhaka and Sapporo Medical University, Japan.
